**In a first-of-its-kind project, School Board Spotlight conducted extensive research into every school board member in the state of Florida.**

School Board Spotlight and its research partners reviewed the public statements, social media, and political stances of 356 school board members for mentions of book bans, curriculum censorship, and racist or anti-LGBTQ+ policies and sentiments. Our research uncovered shocking findings—from banning books to open celebrations of censorship and beyond. We've incorporated our findings into the School Board Spotlight website and turned them into a searchable database of every school board member, highlighting those who are putting politics ahead of Florida's students.

We all want to make sure our children learn the knowledge and skills they need to succeed in the classroom, college, and beyond. But instead of ensuring students get a high-quality education, over 50% of elected members of Florida's school boards are prioritizing banning books, restricting discussions on racism and LGBTQ+ issues, and promoting bigotry and censorship in order to advance an unpopular and radical political agenda.
